



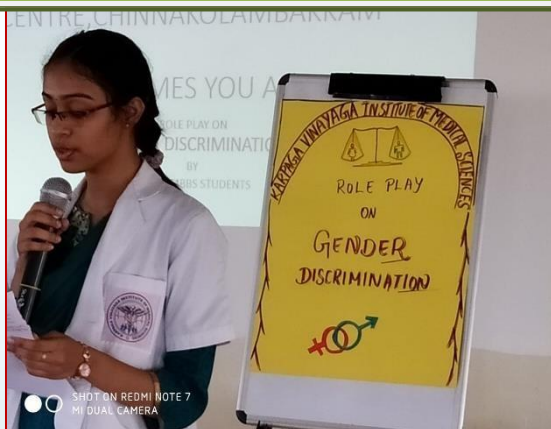

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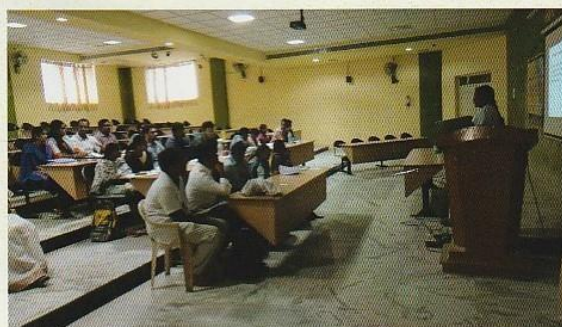

Research Methodology Workshop Department of Community Medicine

A Workshop on Research Methodology was organized by the Department of Community Medicine and Medical Education Unit, of KIMS & RC on September 16th and 17th, 2017, for 1 year postgraduate students (2017-2018 batch). 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The world forest day program was observed by the department of Community Medicine on 21.3.2018. Saplings of medicinal herbs were planted to add value to herbal garden.

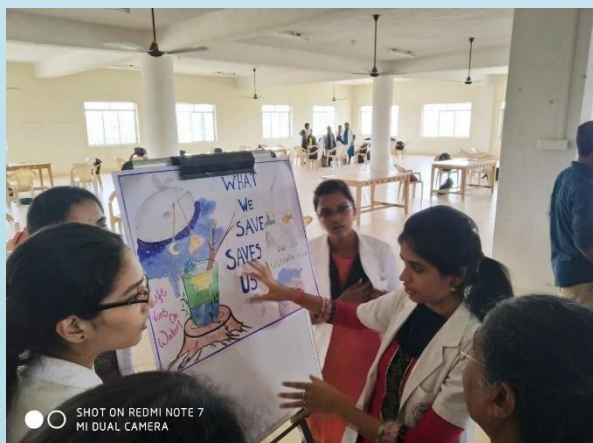
World Forestry Day 2018

I MBBS Foundation Course (2017-2018)

Medical Education Unit

Students who enter medical college are often unprepared for the transition from school to college life and guidance regarding the process is appreciated as it not only ensures proper preparation but also helps reduce apprehension and ensures a smooth transition. Keeping this in mind, and in line with the suggestions of the Medical Council of India, the Medical Education Unit of KIMS & RC conducted a Foundation Course for the 2017-2018 batch of I year MBBS students from 5th to 8th September 2017, to prepare the students to study medicine effectively.

In addition to providing an overview of the MBBS course and the three core subjects of Anatomy, Physiology and Biochemistry and orienting students to the national health scenarios, the foundation course also aimed to emphasize medical ethics, learning skills & communication, life support, computer learning, and other important topics, so that students would develop a holistic approach and effectively study medicine.

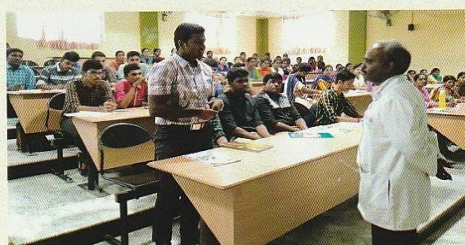


On the first day, after a brief orientation to the Foundation Course by Dr. Navin Rajaratnam, the new students enthusiastically participated in an Ice Breaking session. The principal Dr. Sufala Sunil Vishwasrao then spoke about the institution and the MEU coordinator Dr. Roseline F. William gave the students an orientation to the MBBS course and later explained about the roles that an Indian Medical Graduate was expected to function in. Dr. R.N. Manikandan informed the students about the institution's Anti-ragging policy; Dr. Sunil

Vishwasrao spoke about the functioning of the Disciplinary committee and described life in the campus and Dr. Girija Sivakumar facilitated the student introduction session.

The second day's topics included History of medicine by Dr. D. Thirunaaukarasu, Transition in teaching-learning methods by Dr. Girija Sivakumar, Time management by Dr. R. Kavitha, Mentorship programme in KIMS & RC by Dr. Roseline F. William and Doctor-patient relationship by Dr. G. Uma. Other topics on subsequent days included Basics of first aid by Dr. Navin Rajaratnam, Career options for MBBS students by Dr. S. Appandraj, Professionalism and ethics by Dr. S. Krishnamoorthy, Use of technology in education by Dr. Girija Sivakumar, Stress management by Dr. S. Armuganathan and Student activities in KIMS & RC by Dr. Sunil Vishwasrao. In an attempt to make the foundation course more interactive and with an aim of ensuring that there was active learning, student participation and interaction were encouraged throughout the Foundation Course. Small group sessions, debates and visits in small groups to the Hospital and College also formed part of the activities. The students enthusiastically discussed topics like Roles of a

doctor, Doctor-patient relationship, Attributes for success, etc. in the small group sessions which were conducted; they eloquently presented their opinions in a debate on whether sports, cultural and other co-curricular activities were important for the development of a medical student in college. They enjoyed getting to know the Hospital and College during the visits to the Hospital and College which were arranged as part of the foundation Course. Students thus effectively participated in the



learning process and student feedback that was obtained reflected how much they appreciated the entire Foundation Course and benefited from it.

The CRRRI Orientation Programme Medical Education Unit

The CRRRI Orientation Programme - March 2018 was conducted at KIMS & RC on 26th & 27th March 2018, at Lecture hall complex. The aim of the programme was to familiarize new interns with the work places which include wards, OPD, emergency room and community and their responsibilities. The objectives of the programme were to enable the interns to develop the right attitudes and good communication skills, both verbal and written, to enable them to be aware of the psychosocial needs of the patients, to appreciate the principles in rational drug therapy, develop and refine the skills of requisitions for diagnostic tests, appropriate techniques for collection and transport of samples for laboratory test, to enable them to be aware of ethical issues involved in patient care, tackle common medico-legal issue, identify their role in a multidisciplinary team and recognize their responsibility and accountability towards patient care.

The programme was structured with interactive lectures, allotment of group tasks and discussion of ethical and medico-legal case scenarios. It was a collaborative effort of dedicated senior faculty from the institute. The following topics were discussed in the workshop by the respective faculty: Case sheet writing by Dr. V. Ramachandran, Associate Professor of Medicine; Interdepartmental references by Dr. S.N. Minnalkodi, Professor & Head OBG; Procedure notes by Dr. D. Ramola, Professor Surgery; Discharge



summary by Dr. G.S. Srinivasan, Professor & Head Ophthalmology; Guidelines for request for laboratory investigation by Dr. R. Madhumitha, Assistant Professor Pathology, Dr. Khadeja Bi Assistant Professor Biochemistry, Dr. K. Balan, Associate Professor Microbiology; How to write daily morning and evening notes by Dr. C.S. Arulparithi, Associate Professor Paediatrics; Obtaining consent from patient and its medicolegal implications by Dr. M.K. Siddharthraj, Professor & HOD ENT; Role of the CRRRI in ICU by Dr. K. Appandraj, Professor of Medicine; Role of CRRRI in the OT by Dr. R. Vidya, Professor of Anaesthesia; Role of the CRRRI in casualty by Dr. G. Uma, Assistant Professor of Anaesthesia and Role of the CRRRI in Community medicine by Dr. Archana, Associate Professor Department of Community Medicine. At the end of the programme, The Principal, Dr. Sufala Vishwasrao, addressed and appraised the interns about their responsibilities.

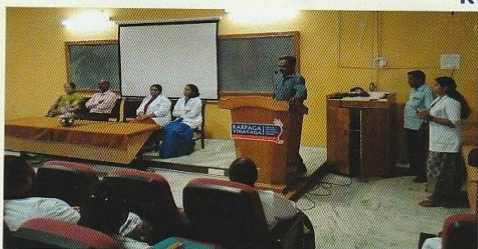
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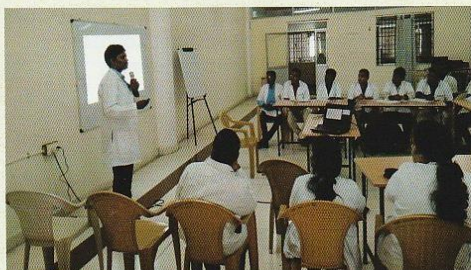
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CRRi Orientation Programme Medical Education Unit

The Medical Education Unit (MEU) of Karpaga Vinayaga Institute of Medical Sciences & Research Centre conducted the CRRi Orientation Programme for the new batch of CRRIs on 19th October 2017. After passing the final MBBS examination, all students are required to undergo compulsory rotational internship for a period of 12 months in order to be eligible for the award of the degree of



Bachelor of Medicine and Bachelor of Surgery (MBBS) and full registration. During this phase of Internship, they learn methods which will help in the actual practice of Medicine and they acquire

skills under supervision so that they may become capable of functioning independently at the end of their training.

The aim of the CRRi Orientation Programme was to create awareness in the interns about the tasks they would be expected to perform and their responsibilities as interns. The Principal Dr. Sufala Sunil Vishwasrao welcomed the 22 new CRRIs to this phase of their training. Dr. M.K. Muralitharan, the Medical Superintendent described the roles of a CRRi.

This was followed by a talk on Professionalism and Medical Ethics by the MEU Coordinator Dr. Roseline F. William.
